# Programme

## CSBRA Competitions

### Unsquadded Competitions

All competitions except the Mowat, Spittal and Grand Prix finals are unsquadded.

- Comp 1 40 shots at 50m
- Comp 2 40 shots at 100 yards
- Comp 3 Dewar
- Comp 4 Aggregate of comps 1, 2 & 3.
- Comp 5 Juniors under 18 on the day of the shoot, unsquadded Dewar (free entry with Comp 4).
- Comp 6 Any Sights, Double Dewar.
- Comp 10 Ladies competition, unsquadded Dewar
- Comp 11 Veterans, over 50, unsquadded Dewar.

### Squadded Competitions

- Comp 8 The Mowat Cup  
The Caithness Open County Championships is shot in 4 squadded stages of a Dewar, the leading three and equal scores in each squad qualifying for the final of 40 shots at 100 yards to be shot at 3pm on Sunday. Equal scores in the final will be decided by a further 20 shots at 100 yards.
- Comp 9 The Spittal Handicap

A squadded handicap Dewar with cash prizes. Restricted to entrants in comp 4, to be shot Saturday and Sunday, 1pm and 2pm. Please state preferred squad. Handicap for Spittal is

### Team competitions

All team competitions are for BONA FIDES club teams, Comp 13 The Bignold Shield for teams of 4, concurrent with Comp 1.

Comp 14 The Harmsworth Shield for teams of 4, concurrent with Comp 2  
Comp 15 The Home Shield for teams of 4, concurrent with Comp 3.

Comp 16 The Junior Cup for teams of 3, concurrent with Comp 5.

Comp 17 The Team Sharpshooter for club teams of 3.

The Gunn Shield is awarded to the best Caithness team.

Discs competitors must also enter at least one other competition

## SSRA Competitions

SSRA English Match: This competition is unsquadded and may be shot separately or concurrently with the above competitions to qualify for Grand Prix second stage. Medals are awarded in each of four classes. There are also whisky and cash prizes, a handsome rose bowl annual trophy for the final and a cup for the leading Caithness shooter.

Under 21 competition: This is concurrent with the SSRA English Match and is free to competitors under 21 years of age on the day of the competition.

Club Pairs: This is concurrent with the SSRA English Match and is handicapped as follows:

A: scratch	B:+8	C:+16	D:+24

C&D Grand Prix Final: The leading 10 competitors in C & D class take part in the C&D Grand Prix Final which is three standard 20 minute details at 50m.

Grand Prix Second Stage The leading 20 competitors in A & B classes take part in the Grand Prix Final. This final

Comprises a modified English Match and ISSF final. The Grand Prix is run as far as possible under ISSF conditions and all finalists' equipment must comply with ISSF regulations. Equipment control will be in operation for the second stage and for the guidance of all other shooters. This competition is also subject to Doping Control. The leading eight competitors in the English Match take part in the ISSF ten-shot final in which each shot is scored to one decimal place as it is fired. The ISSF final total is then aggregated with the English Match total to determine the final ranking. GRAND PRIX FINALISTS WHO DO NOT REACH THE FINAL 8 ARE INVITED TO ASSIST WITH THE ISSF FINAL.

Doping Control: The Organising Committee endorses the rules and guidelines of the SSRA and hence testing for banned substances may be carried out at any time. Please declare any substance or preparations taken in confidence to the meeting organiser or the SSRA Executive Officer. # Caithness Smallbore Rifle Association Open County Meeting And Scottish Smallbore Rifle Association Grand Prix 3

Saturday & Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> July & 10<sup>th</sup> July 2011 at the  
range Thurdistoft Castletown, Caithness

The Caithness meeting is a two-day open shoot at 50 metres and 100 yards.

The Open Meeting hosts an event in the SSRA Grand Prix 50m Championship series. This is shot on Saturday afternoon. Sunday is fully taken up with the Mowat Cup, which is the Caithness Open Championship and the meeting closes with discs competitions and the presentation of prizes and trophies.

The SSRA Open competition, in 4 classes, is the elimination for the A&B and C&D Grand Prix matches. The A&B Grand Prix is for the leading 16 competitors in the Open competition in A & B classes and consists of a qualification match of 60 shots at 50 metres and a final, both shot as far as possible under ISSF rules. The leading 8 in the qualification match then take part in the final and the result is determined by the aggregate of the scores of the qualification match and the final. The C&D Grand Prix is for the leading 10 competitors in C & D classes in the Open competitions and consists of 60 shots at 50 metres under NSRA rules.

Catering will be available on the range.

Accommodation: There are ample inexpensive bed & breakfasts and guest houses in Caithness. Help finding accommodation can be obtained from the Tourist

Regulations: All competitions are run under NSRA rules, except the Grand Prix final which is run under ISSF rules as far as possible. Please note that the C&D Grand Prix final is run under NSRA rules.

Classification for Caithness competitions:

Competitors who do not have a current CSBRA classification should submit averages to be classified as follows:

'A': 98.0 and over	'B': 96.0 and over
'C': 93.0 and over	'D': under 93.0

Competitors may elect to shoot in a higher class.

Classification for SSRA competitions:

Competitors who do not have a current SSRA classification must submit averages to be classified as follows:

'A': 98.5 and over	'B': 97.0 and over
'C': 94.0 and over	'D': under 94.0

The Meeting Committee will consist of any five CSBRA or SSRA Council members including at least 1 member from each association. The Meeting Committee reserves the right to reclassify any competitor.

Schedule: All details commence on the hour and half hour except the Grand Prix final. Some free range space will be available during squadded competitions.
